Introducing ISABEL



ISABEL supports the EU Green Deal and the Digital Transition by focusing on inclusive labour market adaptation. It works to uncover how regions and sectors can respond to large-scale structural changes without leaving workers behind. At the core of the project is a robust, data-driven methodology that combines labour market intelligence, Al tools, and stakeholder co-creation, supporting both policymakers and career professionals. Using cutting-edge Al technologies and extensive regional insights, ISABEL aims to develop fair and efficient strategies for reskilling, upskilling, and labour market policies that promote social and geographical equity.

Key objectives

- Map and analyse job creation/destruction dynamics under twin transitions
- Design foresight tools and Alpowered models to identify atrisk sectors and occupations
- Test inclusive labour market interventions in six Living Labs across Europe
- Develop pathways to minimize job destruction and maximize job creation through socially and geographically fair policies




ISABEL @ Euroguidance Event -16th June 2025
